Through Mama Lyimo's journey across Tanzania in "Into the Light" she meets a 17-year-old orphan named Suzy who is taking refuge in a small annex room of an Anglican Church and begging for food and money to provide for herself and 3 younger siblings Andrew, Simon, and Ceci.

In the film, Suzy explains that her mom may have gotten AIDS because she was poor and uneducated and may have used her body in exchange for the things she needed to provide Suzy and her siblings with food, shelter, and education. Suzy and her siblings all expressed a strong desire to finish their education and build a better life for their families, but it seemed uncertain whether they would be able to finish school in their desperate situation.

The filmmakers of "Into the Light" were so inspired by Suzy and her siblings' desire to go to school that they found American sponsors to pay for all 4 children to attend boarding schools and meet their basic needs. Suzy and her siblings have come from adverse situations, but through education their lives have already been transformed. All the children hope that when they begin working that they will be able to help children that are in situations like they were.

While Suzy, Andrew, Simon, and Ceci have been given the assistance they need to succeed in school, over 1 million children in Tanzania still struggle to meet their basic needs without their parents to love and support them.
